Gaining increasing importance in the analysis of public policies, evaluation evolves within a context of global dialogue on transformational change.

Climate change, accelerating technological and digital transformation, global networks, and other global trends will signal profound changes that will shape the future of our societies in the coming decades. These so-called megatrends, and the importance attached to them by governments and international organisations, reinforce the evaluation community's reflection on the collection and processing of all appropriate data to develop forward-looking evaluations and support evidencebased policymaking. Looking to the future, and considering the speed of development of transformative trends, evaluation must adapt its methods and tools for ex-ante impact assessment and ex post policy evaluation, and develop new approaches to the theory of change, while ensuring that evaluation contributes to the development of relevant theory on how different types of interventions contribute to change in different contexts.

The long-term strategic planning, applying foresight methods, elaborates alternative scenarios for the future, through systematic, participative, and interdisciplinary approaches, to properly prepare to face challenges, risks, or opportunities. With a focus on adaptability and sustainable development, it contributes to policymaking and strategic decision-making in various areas that enhance resilience.

Following current developments, and always within the framework of an established evaluation culture, evaluation approaches in turn, adopt a more complex and long-term perspective for the analysis of multiple crises and challenges, supporting and expanding the knowledge base for decision-makers. It also reviews the evaluation criteria, tools, and methods, invests in holistic and innovative approaches to the theory of change, and seeks new skills for quality evaluations and effective forwardlooking policymaking.

The aim of the 6th HES annual conference is to boost public dialogue on the integration of long-term strategic planning methods and processes into policy analysis and evaluation, within a complex environment of multiple crises and challenges, where the focus of evaluation has already shifted from the study of expected or predictable effects, to the analysis of multiple scenarios for the future, and the development of modular and flexible models of the theory of change. **CONFERENCE PROGRAM**
